- Questions should first be answered by studying the map.
- Portions revised from Mason's original questions are highlighted in blue text.
- As her intended connotation was not clear, Mason's original use of *towns* and *cities* has been retained.
- Mason asked students to measure length and width using lines of longitude and latitude.
- Questions within each section are designed to be answered in the order they appear.
- They are intended to provide a historical look at the map questions originally composed by Mason within a usable framework for contemporary teachers. Teachers will want to modify questions and locations as needed to reflect both the current world and the atlases used by their students.
- These questions and answers were originally posted on April 28, 2020. More recent changes to the world map may not be reflected.
